The meetings of the second session of the Political Consultation Committee between Sudan and Poland were held on Thursday, February 27, 2020 in the buildings of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the Polish capital.



The two sides urged the internal conditions in the two countries, where the Sudanese side provided an elaborate explanation of the conditions in Sudan, beginning with the victory of the glorious December revolution in April and leading to the formation of transitional governance structures. The Sudanese side also touched on the challenges facing the transitional government, foremost of which is removing the name of Sudan from the

American list of countries that sponsor terrorism, achieving peace, and tackling the economic conditions and support that Poland can provide in this regard.

The Polish side also reviewed the internal conditions in Poland and ways to



develop bilateral relations and develop the existing cooperation in the field of education and archeology to include other areas such as training, capacity building and areas of health and agriculture.

On the other hand, the two sides exchanged views on international and regional issues of common

concern, such as the situation in Libya and Yemen, peace in South Sudan, issues of the Renaissance Dam, and developments in the Sahel region.

Mr. Omar Gamaruddin - Minister of State at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs met on Friday February 28, 2020 in the Polish capital Warsaw, Mr. Jackek Czaputowicz - Minister of Foreign Affairs of Poland.

As the meeting dealt with ways to enhance and develop bilateral relations between the two countries in all fields and regional and international issues of common concern, and invited him to visit Sudan to find out the developments

of political and social conditions following the success of the glorious December revolution.

For his part, the Polish Minister of Foreign Affairs expressed his great appreciation to the Sudanese people who succeeded in the change through peaceful means, expressing his follow-up to the active role of youth and women in the success of the December revolution. He affirmed his country's keenness to support Sudan with the ability to cross the transitional period, stressing his country's desire to support the priorities of the Transitional government's work, on top of which are issues of peace and economic challenges. He explained that his country is keen on exchanging experiences, transferring technology and creating strategic partnerships with the public and private sectors in Sudan in a manner that enhances economic relations between the two countries. He also affirmed his desire to visit Sudan as soon as possible, and the meeting reviewed joint projects between the two countries and efforts made to implement them.

The two sides secured the importance of continuing the holding of political consultation committees between the two countries in a monotonous manner, as it is the mechanism adopted to follow up on bilateral relations between the two countries in various fields and to coordinate positions and exchange support in international forums.
